Ministry of Health Officials, representatives from the Professional Colleges, Development Partners, Past Presidents, Fellows, Council and members of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka and other delegates, as well as the family members of the inducting president graced the occasion. Dr. Sudath Senaratne, Outgoing President, welcomed the gathering and presented the activities conducted during 2024 by the PSSL. This was followed by the reading out of the citation of inducting president, and the induction of Dr. Harendra Dassanayake as the 24th President of the PSSL by Dr. Sudath senaratne. The Chief Guest and the Guest of Honour addressed the gathering, appreciating the efforts of the PSSL.

The presidential address was the highlight of the occasion. In his presidential address, Dr. Harendra Dassanayake introduced the theme of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka for year 2025, 'Enhancement of Perinatal Outcomes through Maternal and Perinatal Mortality Surveillance and Response'. He emphasized the importance of surveillance and response in maternal and perinatal mortality and explained his plans for facilitating this initiative.

From Secretary's Diary.....



(01 December 2024 – 31st March 2025)

The council of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka (PSSL) for the year 2025 was appointed at the Annual General Meeting held on the 15th of December 2024 at Hilton Colombo Residencies.

The induction ceremony of the 24th President of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka, Dr. Harendra Dassanayake, was held on the 31st of January 2025 at the Sri Lanka Foundation, Colombo 07. Dr. Anil Jasignghe, Secretary, Ministry of Health and Mass Media graced the occasion as the Chief Guest and Dr. Asela Gunawardena, Director General of Health Services was the Guest of Honour at this occasion, which was attended by Past presidents, Fellows and membership of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka, Ministry of Health officials, representatives from professional colleges, development partners and other invitees.

A Capacity Building Workshop organized by the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka was held at Base Hospital Nikaweratiya on the 19th of March 2025. It was successfully conducted as three parallel workshops focusing on strengthening maternal and perinatal care. A Neonatal Life Support programme, a workshop on Obstetric Emergencies and a workshop on Maternal and Perinatal Death Surveillance and Response (MPDSR) were organized by the council members of the three specialties at the PSSL, Neonatologists and Paediatricians, Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, and Community Physicians, respectively, with the support of regional specialists and other experts. Around 150 Medical Officers, Nursing Officers and Public Health Midwives representing healthcare institutions in the North-Western province were trained at these workshops.

The President and representatives of the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka attended, provided their expertise and supported in the coordination of the Neonatal Life Support Training Programmes organized by the DGH Nuwara-Eliya team in March 2025.

Two nominations from the PSSL were sent on request, for the National Guidelines Committee established by the Directorate of Healthcare Quality and Safety of the Ministry of Health.

The three Council meetings of the PSSL for the months of January, February and March were held on 16th of January, 20th of February and 24th of March, respectively, at the SLCOG Council Room.

The President and representatives from the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka will attend a meeting chaired by the Minister of Health and Mass media, on Technical Evaluation of Medicinal Drugs and Devices, on 2nd of April 2025.

STRENGTHENING MATERNAL AND NEONATAL CARE: CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOPS HELD IN NIKAWERATIYA – MARCH 2025

The Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka successfully organized three targeted Capacity Building Workshops on 19th March 2025 in Nikaweratiya, with the aim of enhancing the competencies of healthcare professionals involved in maternal and neonatal care across the region. These workshops provided valuable opportunities for knowledge-sharing, hands-on training, and inter-professional collaboration to strengthen care delivery and improve health outcomes. The workshops conducted were as follows:

Neonatal Life Support Program

Held at Base Hospital (BH) Nikaweratiya, this hands-on session focused on life-saving skills essential for managing neonatal emergencies. A total of 32 medical officers and nursing officers from the NICU and SCBU units of Base Hospitals in Nikaweratiya, Puttalam, Galgamuwa, and Dambadeniya took part in this vital training

Obstetric Emergencies Program

This interactive workshop brought together 50 healthcare professionals, including medical officers, nursing officers, and Public Health Midwives, from obstetrics and gynecology units of the same four Base Hospitals. Participants were provided with practical training and updates on the timely management of common obstetric emergencies to improve maternal outcomes.

Strengthening Maternal and Perinatal Death Surveillance and Response (MPDSR) This session was designed for field-level staff, including Medical Officers of Health, Assistant Medical Officers of Health, Public Health Nursing Sisters, and Public Health Midwives from the Polpithigama, Nikaweratiya, Mahawa, Kobeigane, Wariyapola, and Anamaduwa MOH areas. The workshop focused on strengthening the implementation of MPDSR processes and encouraged a culture of continuous learning and accountability to prevent avoidable deaths.

These workshops demonstrated the Society's continued commitment to building capacity at all levels of the healthcare system. By equipping frontline professionals with updated knowledge and critical skills, the Perinatal Society of Sri Lanka reinforced its pivotal role in advancing maternal and neonatal health outcomes in the country.







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
